SECTION 2: Hazard(s) Identification

GHS Classification: Not classified as hazardous under GHS for acute health or environmental hazards based on available data. May cause mild skin/eye irritation on prolonged or repeated contact. Combustible material - combustible solid - can burn if heated above its flash point (typically $\approx 196^{\circ}\text{C}$) or exposed to a strong ignition source; fine dust may pose a combustible dust hazard in bulk processing

SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

Eye Contact	Rinse with plenty of water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.
Skin Contact	Wash with soap and water. Generally low-irritating; remove contaminated clothing if significant contact occurs. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.
Inhalation	Not expected to be a significant exposure route under normal handling given low volatility. If vapour/mist from heated material is inhaled and discomfort occurs, move to fresh air and seek medical attention if symptoms persist.
Ingestion	Rinse mouth with water. Do NOT induce vomiting. Seek medical attention if a significant quantity is ingested or discomfort occurs.

SECTION 5: Fire-Fighting Measures

- Combustible material – combustible solid – can burn if heated above its flash point (typically $\approx 196^{\circ}\text{C}$) or exposed to a strong ignition source; fine dust may pose a combustible dust hazard in bulk processing

- Suitable extinguishing media: water spray/fog, foam, CO₂, dry chemical – select based on surrounding fire
- Cool fire-exposed containers with water spray
- Fire-fighters should wear SCBA in enclosed or heavily smoke-logged conditions

SECTION 6: Accidental Release Measures

- Contain spill to prevent entry into drains, sewers or waterways
- Absorb with inert absorbent material (sand, vermiculite, earth) and collect in suitable containers for disposal
- Spilled material can create a slip hazard on hard floors – clean promptly
- Wear appropriate PPE (gloves, safety glasses) during clean-up

SECTION 7: Handling and Storage

- Keep away from heat, sparks, open flame and other ignition sources
- Avoid prolonged or repeated skin/eye contact; wash hands after handling
- Store in a cool, dry, covered area away from direct sunlight
- Keep containers/tanks tightly closed to minimise oxidation and odour development
- Keep away from ignition sources; if handled as powder/fine flake, avoid dust accumulation near heat sources (combustible dust precaution)

SECTION 8: Exposure Controls / Personal Protection

Occupational Exposure Limits	No specific OEL established for this substance; handle per good industrial hygiene practice
Engineering Controls	General ventilation is normally sufficient; local exhaust recommended if heated
Eye/Face Protection	Safety glasses recommended when handling bulk/concentrate
Hand Protection	General-purpose chemical-resistant gloves recommended for prolonged or repeated contact
Respiratory Protection	Not normally required under standard handling conditions

SECTION 10: Stability and Reactivity

- Stable under normal conditions of storage, handling and use
- Combustible material – avoid heat, open flame and strong ignition sources
- May slowly oxidise/darken in colour on prolonged exposure to air and heat
- Incompatible materials: strong oxidising agents

SECTION 11: Toxicological Information

- Low acute oral and dermal toxicity based on published data for this class of fatty acid/fatty acid mixture
- May cause mild irritation to skin and eyes on prolonged or repeated direct contact
- Not classified as carcinogenic, mutagenic, or toxic to reproduction based on available information

SECTION 12: Ecological Information

- Not classified as hazardous to aquatic organisms under GHS criteria based on available data
- Readily/inherently biodegradable, consistent with published data for natural fatty acid derivatives
- Avoid large-scale release to waterways as general environmental good practice

- Dispose of product and packaging in accordance with local, state and national regulations
- Not expected to require classification as hazardous waste under standard criteria; confirm local requirements before disposal
